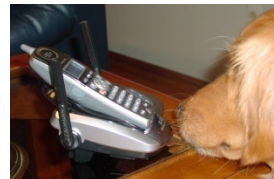
Service Dogs



Our FBI Service Dogs are trained to assist a person with a physical disability. An FBI Service Dog can assist the person and help them to be more independent. Besides companionship, an FBI Service Dog might assist the person with:

- Retrieving dropped items
- Retrieve the telephone
- Get help
- Pull a wheelchair
- Open and close doors in the home

Hearing Dogs



Our FBI Hearing Dogs are trained to assist a person who is deaf or hearing impaired. An FBI Hearing Dog alerts the person to sounds in their home. Besides companionship, an FBI Hearing Dog might alert the person to:

- Doorbell / Door Knock
- Ringing telephone
- Baby Cry
- Smoke Alarm

Facility Dogs



Our FBI Facility Dogs work with clergy, educational, mental health and health care professionals. Our canines help these professionals meet their client's treatment goals. FBI Facility Dogs are selected for their superior temperament and are reliable and calm.

In selecting an FBI Facility Dog for your needs, we match each dog's temperament to your program's needs. These canines only have access to the facility for which they were trained.

Home Therapy Dogs



Our FBI Home Therapy Dogs are trained to provide companionship to a person or child who may have a wide range of physical, cognitive or developmental disabilities and who may not qualify for a fully-working Assistance Dog. An FBI Home Therapy Dog can help provide companionship, motivation, and emotional support.
